Science Key Vocabulary
<b>Condensation</b> - a cooling process where gas vapour turns back into a liquid.
<b>Evaporation</b> – a heating process turning a liquid into a gas.
<b>Insoluble</b> – will not dissolve in water
<b>Irreversible</b> – a change that cannot be undone or altered.
<b>Reversible</b> – a change that can be turned around.
<b>Soluble</b> – will dissolve in a liquid
