This term we will be learning about ourselves and our families. We will be talking about similarities, differences and how we see ourselves. We will also take part in a variety of creative activities producing pictures of ourselves. We will also join in games that will help us to build relationships with others and help us to understand our emotions, and grow in confidence and independence as we become more familiar with the setting.

This half term we will have the opportunities to get to know one another, form and maintain new friendships and become familiar with the new school environment and daily routines.

The children are beginning to settle into their new routines and environment, and will grow in confidence over the coming weeks. You can help to make things as easy as possible for them by practising with them going to the toilet independently, and putting their coats on and off by themselves. Every half term we cover a new topic and this half term's topic is 'Colour'.

The areas that we will be covering are:

Black and white • Red • Yellow • Blue • Green Rainbows • Colours in the Natural World.

We will be learning lots of songs and rhymes, listening to lots of stories and doing many exciting activities. Please read our 'Activities at Home' hand-out which gives you lots of ideas of things to do at home with your child to help with their learning.

We hope that you and your child have a happy time and that they enjoy learning and growing with us!

We have an exciting first half term in Year 1 where the children will be learning all about adventures and exploration. In Literacy we will be reading exciting adventure stories so we can describe their settings and retell them using role play, pictures and sentences. In Topic we will be looking at places we can go for adventures, thinking about how we might get there and investigating what we might find. We also hope to go on our very own adventures around school

In Numeracy we will be looking to gain a deeper understanding of number through counting, comparing and ordering. We will then move on to addition to 20.

Over the next week, your child will begin to choose reading books to read at home as part of our guided reading sessions. It is essential the children bring in their book bags daily so we can have quiet reading in class and the children can regularly change their reading books. Spellings and Brainbuster books will also be given out on a Friday to learn at home and be tested the following Friday.

All children need a PE kit of a white top, black shorts or leggings and black pumps. We ask that children keep their kit in their lockers until the half term break when they will be sent home for washing.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask. We are available on the yard at 3.15pm each day.

We look forward to a brilliant year and want to take this opportunity to thank you for your support.

YEAR3

Welcome back! This half term, our new Year 3 class will be learning about the Victorians.

We will identify events that happened during this period, and particularly the impact of the Industrial Revolution on the landscape and people of England. We will focus on the lives of engineers like George Stephenson, George Cayley and Isambard Kingdom Brunel, and the influences they had on rail, air and sea transport. This will link into our literacy work as we research their achievements in detail, and recount events from this period. We will also be writing extended adventure stories based on Dragonbreath, and develop our skills in using prepositions and subordinating conjunctions linked to the passing of time. In maths, we will be extending our skills with place value, and partitioning bigger numbers I different ways. This will support your children with addition and subtraction problems. We will be revising our x2x3x4x5x10 multiplication tables


and applying them to division facts. Our science work will be focused on forces and we will carry out and record a number of experiments to investigate pushes, pulls, gravity and air resistance.

Please ensure your child has a full PE kit in school throughout the term for indoor and outdoor lessons, with trainers for outdoor PE. Reading books are sent out on a Friday to be returned with a book report the following Friday, please ensure your child reads on a regular basis to maintain their progress. Home learning will be given out each night, to be returned the next day, except Monday spelling lists, which can be practised throughout the week.

If you have any questions, please feel free to see either of us after school.

This half term in Year 4, our main topic will be the Vikings. We will be focusing on exploration. We will be thinking about what makes a great explorer and how the Vikings became such good explorers. We will link the Viking topic into our art work where we will work towards creating a picture of a Viking exploration using pastels. In science, we will be investigating forces. We will be looking at what they are and why they are useful. We will then go onto experimenting with materials and seeing which material would make the best sail for a Viking longship.

In Maths, we are focusing on place value with our question being 'How can we compare big numbers quickly?' We will then move onto money and will look at changing $\mathfrak L$ to pence and vice versa, followed by work with the 4 operations in relation to money problems.

In Literacy, we are studying 'Black Dan,' an adventure story. We will be focusing on recognising and using suspense techniques within our writing and will be using the 5W's to describe a setting. After this, we will be writing a newspaper article about a Viking exploration.

This year, we will be doing P.E. on a Wednesday and Thursday so please ensure full P.E. kits are in school on these days.

Homework will usually go out on a Tuesday and Wednesday and should be returned the following day. Spellings are given out at the start of the week, for a test on Friday. Home reading books and book reports should be bought in on a Monday.

YEAR 5

This term we will be looking at exploration and explorers. We will be focusing on Mary Kingsley, James Cook and Marco Polo.

We will be looking at the places that they explored and the adventures they had. We will be answering the big question "Why should we remember these explorers?" In science we are looking at animal adaptation and evolution. We will be assessing what adaptation is and how it has shaped the living things on our planet. I suggest watching any BBC wildlife program, be it David Attenborough or Deadly 60, as these will really spark the imagination. In art we will be looking at mixing powder paint in order to gain the colours we need to paint like the explorers did when recording the new found lands. PE will be focused on lacrosse and gymnastics, full indoor and outdoor kit is required. In English we will be looking at story openings and recount writing, using our topic for inspiration. Maths will focus on place value, addition and subtraction. If you have the opportunity, get your child to practice adding up the shopping on receipts and working out the change.


Home Learning

Welcome to Year 6. What an exciting year we have ahead!

This term our topic is Polar Explorers and in English children will begin writing biographies of famous explorers. Science will focus on plant and animal life cycles, food webs and adaptations to polar regions, while in Maths we will be ensuring children have mastered basic place value and the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. For P.E. children will go swimming on Thursday morning and will need their swimming

costume, towel and a cap for those with long hair. They should also have their P.E. kits in school at all times.

Children will also have homework that they need to take home and bring back every day. Later in the year, we will offer early morning study every day. As usual, if you have any questions we will be in the playground every afternoon.

Before and after school care club


