## A warm welcome to all our new and returning children, and their parents/carers.

During this half term, we will be encouraging the children to build relationships with other children and staff within the room. We would like to welcome all the children to Oasis Limeside. We hope you've had a relaxing summer and are excited for the year ahead.

Please provide spare clothes for your child so that we are able to change them if necessary.



THIS TERM OUR TOPIC IS MARVELLOUS ME!





This term is off to a fantastic start with all the children settling in brilliantly and participating really well in all our learning.

We are about to become authors by re-telling some of the stories we have read in English. In Phonics, the children have been practising their blending to read a variety of words. In Maths, we have loved representing numbers in different ways and using lots of different equipment. We are about to begin work on our number bonds. The children have already started making fantastic progress in all their learning and we are very proud of their efforts!

This half term we are learning all about Adventures. We will be having lots of adventures when we learn about New York, the South Pole, Greece, the Himalayas and India. In Literacy, we are going to be reading a variety of stories involving adventures and we will even create our own 'Wild Things' and other characters. In Maths, we are going to be mastering numbers between 0 and 20, so that we can count up to and back from 20 with ease. After that, we will begin work on adding and subtracting within 20.

If you have any pictures of adventures that your child has been on, and that you wouldn't mind sharing with the class, we would love to see them so we can learn about different types of adventure.

Homework and spellings will continue to be sent out on Friday and we ask that children please bring in a school P.E. kit (white top, dark shorts and pumps) which can be kept in their locker for the half term.

We will also be sending our class reading bear home with one child each Friday. The bear will travel in a bag with a bedtime story and a notebook. Please could you help your child read the story to our bear and then write or draw pictures of all the other exciting things the bear has joined in with at home? The bear will be returned to school the following Monday, ready to go home with another child later in the week.

# THIS TERM OUR TOPIC IS THE VICTORIANS


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
Welcome back! This half term, our new Year 3 class will be learning about the Victorians.

We will identify events that happened during this period, and particularly the impact of the Industrial Revolution on the landscape and people of England. We will focus on the lives of engineers like George Stephenson, George Cayley and Isambard Kingdom Brunel, and the influences they had on rail, air and sea transport. This will link into our literacy work as we research their achievements in detail, and recount events from this period. We will also be writing extended adventure stories based on Dragon Breath, and develop our skills in using prepositions and subordinating conjunctions linked to the passing of time. In maths, we will be extending our skills with place value, and partitioning bigger numbers I different ways. This will support your children with addition and subtraction problems. We will be revising our x2x3x4x5x10 multiplication tables and applying them to division facts. Our science work will be focussed on forces and we will carry out and record a number of experiments to investigate pushes, pulls, gravity and air resistance.

Please ensure your child has a full PE kit in school throughout the term for indoor and outdoor lessons, with trainers for outdoor PE. Reading books are sent out on a Friday to be returned with a book report the following Friday, please ensure your child reads on a regular basis to maintain their progress. Home learning will be given out each night, to be returned the next day, except Monday spelling lists, which can be practised throughout the week.

If you have any questions, please feel free to see either of us after school.





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THIS TERM OUR TOPIC IS ABOUT THE VIKINGS

This half term in year 4, our main topic will be the Vikings. We will be focusing on exploration.

We will be thinking about what makes a great explorer and how the Vikings became such good explorers. We will link the Viking topic into our art work where we will work towards creating a picture of a Viking exploration using pastels. In Science, we will be investigating forces. We will be looking at what they are and why they are useful. We will then go onto experimenting with materials and seeing which material would make the best sail for a Viking Longship.

In Maths, we are focusing on place value with our question being, how we can compare big numbers quickly? We will then move onto money and will look at changing  $\mathfrak L$  to pence and vice versa. We will then work with the 4 operations in relation to money problems.

In Literacy, we are studying 'Black Dan,' an adventure story. We will be focusing on recognising and using suspense techniques within our writing and will be using the 5W's to describe a setting. After this, we will be writing a newspaper article about a Viking exploration.

Please ensure full P.E. kits are in all week.

Homework will usually go out on a Tuesday and Wednesday and should be returned the following day. Spellings are given out at the start of the week, for a test on Friday. Home reading books and book reports should be bought in on a Friday.


Welcome to year 6... What an exciting year ahead!

This term our topic is Polar Explorers and in English children will begin writing biographies of famous explorers.

Science will focus on plant and animal life cycles, food webs and adaptations to polar regions, while in Maths we will be ensuring children have mastered basic place value and the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. For P.E. children will go swimming on Thursday morning and will need their swimming costume, towel and a cap for those with long hair. They should also have their P.E. kits in school at all times.

Children will also have homework that they need to take home and bring back every day. Later in the year, we will offer early morning study every day. As usual, if you have any questions we will be in the playground every afternoon.


